It is estimated that this will bring more than 100 million women into the labour force. This year, G20 countries commit to take necessary steps to implement this goal Under Turkey's G20 Presidency Women-20 (W20) is established as a full-fledged G20 engagement group. W20 will focus on promoting gender inclusive economic growth
Energy access	Goal 7. Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all Relevant sub-goal: 7.1 By 2030, ensure universal access to affordable, reliable and modern energy services	G20 Energy Access Action Plan to be adopted by G20 Energy Ministers at their first ever meeting in Istanbul on 2 October 2015 G20 Energy Access Action Plan will focus on Sub Saharan Africa and G20 Energy Ministers will meet African Energy Ministers and other stakeholders to discuss what can be done to enhance energy access in Africa.
